Reference	Reference AEC 2000 is available in site office.		
Vehicle Condition	The vehicle must be in sound mechanical and roadworthy condition. Prestart and maintenance records available.		
Carry boxes	The explosives are to be carried in a clean lockable compartment and shall be protected from any contact with iron or steel. Compartments are lockable and secured to vehicle		
Load Separation	High explosives and detonators are to be transported in separate compartments of the vehicle or separated by at least 2 metres.		
Signage	When carrying explosives the vehicle will display at the front and rear and both sides, a placard displaying the word 'EXPLOSIVES' in red capital letters not less than 150 mm high on a white background.		
Class Labels	Class labels appropriate to the load being transported are to be displayed at the front and rear of the vehicle.		
EPG Available	Emergency Procedure Guides appropriate to the product being carried shall be carried in a holder attached to the driver's cabin door.		
FFE	A serviceable dry chemical fire extinguisher of at least 30B rating shall be securely mounted on the vehicle in an accessible position.		
Warning Signs	The vehicle shall carry three double-sided triangular reflector signals and a pair of wheel chocks.		
Authority to Possess	The person transporting such explosives is licensed to be in possession of explosives (Shotfirer).
